

SONOMA RETREAT CENTER EXPANSION

Peter Berking, a long-standing devotee, has transformed his home in Sebastopol, California, into a retreat center—Sri Ramana Maharshi Center of Sonoma—to serve the community of Bhagavan's devotees. Nestled amidst the natural beauty of Sonoma County, the center offers a serene environment for spiritual retreat and reflection.

The satsang hall is now open for drop-in, independent meditation or study. Devotees may request a door code for access at any time. The hall accommodates up to 45 people.

Overnight facilities are also available, with space for up to 12 devotees. A new lending library houses the main Ashram publications, making Bhagavan's teachings easily accessible.

Affiliated with Sri Ramanasramam and Sri Ramana Maharshi Heritage, the center welcomes both seasoned practitioners and newcomers, fostering spiritual exploration in a warm and dharmic atmosphere.


BOOK AND CALENDAR SALES


We see the bookstore as a vital part of our mission to keep Bhagavan's teachings alive and feel deeply blessed by its successful growth.

Since then, they have gathered regularly in devotees' homes and observed Bhagavan's Jayanti, Aradhana, and Advent at Arunachala annually. In 2021, these groups came together under the formal banner of Sri Ramana Maharshi Heritage (SRMH), a registered non-profit organization.

This year, both Satsang groups celebrated Bhagavan's Aradhana with devotion and joy. In California, Swami Chidananda, founder, Trustee, and chief resource person of the FOWAI FORUM, an NGO dedicated to spiritual education, and an ardent devotee of Bhagavan, gave an inspiring talk on Bhagavan's greatness and the continuing relevance of his teachings.



In India

ASHRAM KUMBHABHISHEKAM

SRMH supported Sri Ramanasramam's sacred Maha Kumbhabhishekam, held from August 18–20, 2025.

As part of the celebrations, extensive renovation work was undertaken at the shrines of Matrubhuteshwara and Sri Ramaneshwara Mahalingams, in full accordance with traditional śāstric principles. These periodic renovations and Kumbhabhishekams are far more than structural undertakings; they are profound acts of preservation and consecration. Through the decades, such ceremonies have safeguarded the sanctity, spiritual power, and architectural beauty of these hallowed shrines with unwavering devotion and discipline.




Sri Ramanasramam Kumbhabhishekam programme

The first Kumbhabhishekam in 1949, led by the revered Vaidyanatha Sthapathi, inaugurated a sacred tradition that has since been carried forward by his lineage. In this auspicious year of 2025, his grandson, Selvanatha Sthapathi, once again upheld and renewed this timeless legacy.

CENTENARY COIN



Sri Ramana Maharshi Centenary coin

On May 15, 2025, the Government of India officially announced the issuance of a special ₹100 commemorative coin to mark the Centenary of Sri Ramanasramam. Minted in silver (99.9% purity), the coin weighs 40 grams, measures 44 mm in diameter, and features 200 serrations along its edge. Classified as a numismatic coin, it is distinct from everyday currency. Such coins are valued for their historical significance and unique design, making them especially treasured by collectors, historians, and those devoted to preserving cultural heritage.


Devotees in the U.S. may pre-order the coin through the <u>Sri Ramana Maharshi Heritage website</u> by selecting "Coin" from the pull-down menu.

The coin will be formally released at a special event in Fremont, California, on September 14, 2025. Presiding over the function will be Dr. Venkat S. Ramanan, President of Sri Ramanasramam; Sri Rakesh Adlakha, Deputy Consul General of India in San Francisco; Dr. David Frawley (Pandit Vamadeva Shastri), Padma Bhushan awardee; and Sri Raj Salwan, Mayor of Fremont.
